In 2012 and 2013, the Dutch Training and Study Centre for the Judiciary (SSR, the Netherlands), the National School of Judiciary and Public Prosecution (KSSIP, Poland) and the Consiglio Superiore della Magistratura (CSM, Italy) organise a series of judicial training seminars on the fight against trafficking in human beings. This series of seminars will take place as part of the project "Towards a European approach to judicial training on trafficking in human beings", which is financially supported under the Prevention of and Fight against Crime Programme from the European Commission. It is our pleasure and honour to invite two members of the judiciary (judges and prosecutors) from each of the Member States of the European Union and Turkey for this series of seminars. The first seminar will take place in Amsterdam on **9 - 10 February 2012** and will focus on sharing experiences and best practices. We are very proud Ms. Myria Vassiliadou, the EU Anti Trafficking Coordinator, will honour us with her presence.

The second seminar will be organised by CSM in the second half of 2012 in Italy with a focus on the victim. The third and final seminar will be organised by KSSIP in the first half of 2013 in Poland and will be a professional encounter. Magistrates who are interested in attending the series of seminars should work in the field of the fight against trafficking in human beings.

More details on the programme of the first seminar and conditions for participation will be announced soon. Working languages will be English and French.

Participants are responsible for organizing and paying their own travel costs to the venue of the seminar, and to take care of their own hotel reservation. SSR will provide a

list of hotels in the area of the seminar venue. SSR will reimburse the travel costs to a maximum of € 400,= for the return journey. For the costs of the hotel and meals, a per diem will be provided.
